KETTLEWELL AND STARBOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

KETTLEWELL VILLAGE HALL:

Built in 1926, Kettlewell Village Hall is the village hall for the parish of Kettlewell and Starbotton. The hall is located in the centre of Kettlewell, and provides one of the main meeting places for members of our community. Visitors to the Dale and residents of nearby villages are always welcome at events held in the hall.

A wide variety of social events take place in the hall as well as table tennis, bowls, film nights, toddler groups, Parish Council meetings and a number of external bookings including wedding parties, income from which enable us to let local people and groups use the hall at a subsidised rate.

The hall is a charity (Kettlewell Village Hall CIO 1203405) run by a committee elected at a general meeting held in September every year at which all residents can vote. The hall is self-financing, and its main source of income is the Kettlewell Scarecrow Festival as well as the Duck Race, Film Nights and hall booking fees.

Over the past few years, the hall has been significantly upgraded with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment, new kitchen appliances as well as being completely redecorated. It is now a very welcoming space.

Kettlewell is a harmonious community which prides itself on making everyone feel at home without pressuring anyone to join in more than they wish. We hope to see you in the hall whenever you feel like coming and we guarantee a friendly and warm welcome.

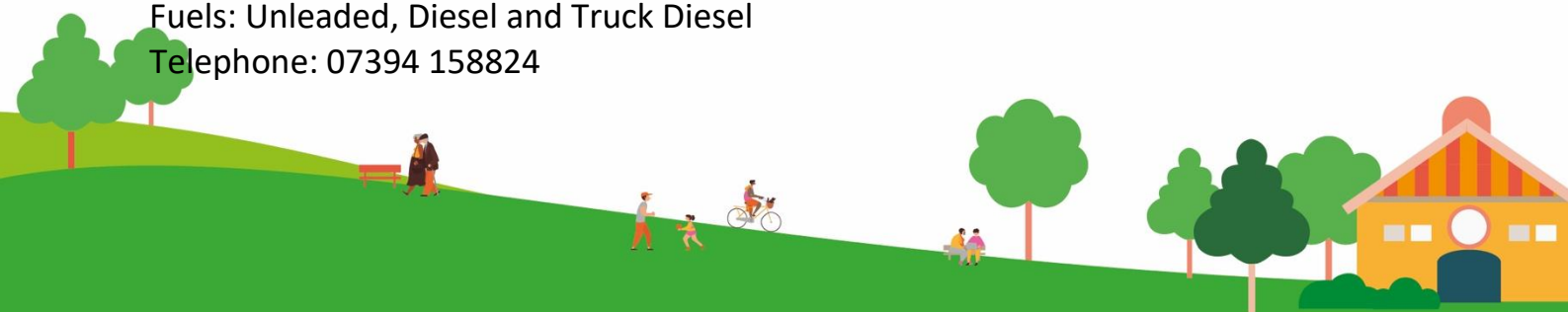

Kettlewell Scarecrow Festival

Traditionally held from the second Saturday in August and held for nine days, the first Scarecrow Festival was held back in 1994 as a fundraising event for Kettlewell Primary School.

Over the last 30 years, the festival has grown from strength to strength, and it is renowned for the high standards of creations and characters, who are usually easy to identify.

Kettlewell Scarecrow Festival now welcomes thousands of visitors from far and wide. Many have been coming back year after year – often first with their children and now with their grandchildren!

Whilst the fundraising for local groups as well as for Kettlewell School, the village hall and St Mary's Church is needed as much, if not more, than ever, it's all the happy faces and positive feedback that still makes all the effort worthwhile. Kettlewell & District Horticultural Society Show

Traditionally held on the third Saturday in June, Buckden Gala is a traditional village Gala and Fell Race - A great day out in the dales with live music, stalls, dog show, children's races, crafts, grand draw, bouncy castle, coconut shy, beer tent, hot dogs, ice cream and tea room as well as the famous Buckden Pike Fell Race. It is a great opportunity for the community to work together, have fun and raise money to support the Village Institute.

Kilnsey Show

As the Yorkshire Dales' premier agricultural show, Kilnsey Show has been marking the end of summer in the Dales since 1897. Set in the picturesque village of Kilnsey under the shadow of the spectacular Crag, Kilnsey Show & Sports is home to a showcase of keenly contested livestock competitions, equine events and sheepdog trials, together with a fabulous display of baking, handicrafts, horticulture, and of course, the famous Crag race. Showcasing country life, farming, and traditions which have stood the test of time, alongside a taste of local cuisine and retail, the exciting annual show offers an enjoyable day out for families and friends of all ages.

First Responders

First Responders

Our Community First Responder (CFR) scheme is a life-saving partnership with local communities. As authorised volunteers CFRs form teams across Yorkshire to help reduce the number of pre-hospital deaths.

Our CFRs are trained to provide life-saving treatment for patients in the vital first few minutes of an emergency until our ambulance crew arrives.

When a 999 call is received in our Emergency Operations Centre (EOC), an ambulance response is dispatched. At the same time, a CFR on-call in the area can be alerted and asked to attend the incident to ensure that help reaches the patient as quickly as possible.

Defibrillators

Defibs are sited at Kettlewell Village Hall and next to the telephone box on the main road through Starbotton.

BUSES RUN BETWEEN SKIPTON, GRASSINGTON AND UPPER WHARFEDALE AS FOLLOWS:

- Upper Wharfedale [Venturer 72B service](#) local bus service runs between Buckden, Kettlewell, Grassington & Hebden in Upper Wharfedale. The service runs three times per day in each direction on school days five times per day on Saturdays and school holidays. Buses connect with the Grassington / Skipton 72 service at Grassington
- There is a Sunday bus service operated by [DalesBus](#) south from Kettlewell all year round and north to Wensleydale in summer.
- Keighley Bus Company service 72 runs between Skipton and Grassington seven days a week.
